VOLUNTEERS

182 wonderful volunteers helped us to accomplish the following:

- Renewed Classics and The Thrift Shop volunteers raised \$20,756
- Inter-Library Loan volunteers loaned 1,771 items & borrowed 631 items
- Book donations were sorted & boxed in preparation for our book sales raising \$6,649
- Our doors were open 90 hours a week, 6 days a week due to our committed volunteers
- Volunteers checked out and returned to the shelves over 129,970 items
- Volunteers contacted our members regarding overdue items
- Volunteers created displays & bulletin boards; shelf read, assisted with programming, answered questions, and recommended good books to read
- Volunteers repaired books, kept computers working and even served hamburgers at the Shamrock Festival
- Our volunteers greeted over 50,000 people with a smile and assisted them in their search for information
- Volunteers helped young students improve their reading skills
- Volunteers stocked our outreach shelves at the Lakefield Marina and the Ennismore Campground
- Volunteers trained in the use of our electronic databases
- Several student volunteers worked to earn the 40 hours of community service necessary for them to graduate
