The Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield Public Library is committed to supporting and enriching the ongoing life of the community by providing resources and opportunities for recreational reading, life-long learning and personal development to individuals of all ages.

VOLUNTEERS

In 2010 we welcomed new volunteers to our Chemong Treasure Trove gently used clothing store.

This year our 163 wonderful volunteers helped us to accomplish the following:

- Renewed Classics, The Thrift Shop, Causeway Treasure Trove volunteers raised \$31,364
- Inter-Library Loan volunteers loaned 1017 items & borrowed 724 items
- Book donations were sorted & boxed in preparation for our book sales raising \$5,845
- Our doors were open 103 hours a week, 6 days a week due to our committed volunteers
- Volunteers catalogued and processed more than 7,000 items
- Volunteers registered over 1,100 new users
- Volunteers checked out and returned to the shelves over 134,000 items
- Volunteers contacted our members regarding overdue items
- Volunteers created displays & bulletin boards; shelf read, assisted with programming, answered questions, and recommended good books to read
- Volunteers repaired books and kept our computers working
- Our volunteers welcomed in excess of 70,000 people with a smile to our libraries
- Volunteers assisted the public with their search for information
- Volunteers helped young students improve their reading skills

Computers



Industry Canada's **Community Access Program** (CAP) grant allowed us to hire students for 1-on-1 tutoring in computer use and to provide access to those people who might not have computers or Internet access in their homes. In 2010, we provided training and assistance through the Community Access Program more than 700 times. Our Internet computers were used over 17,600 times.

Highlights

- Ennismore Library received a complete facelift that included new carpet & furnishings, improved air quality, a teen area and exterior improvements.
- A Teen programming grant resulted in new collection items and programs that included Teen Iron Chef, game & movie night, and art, yoga and break dancing classes.
- Fireside readings featured local authors
- Healthy aging series raised community's awareness of health issues
- Downloadable audio & eBooks were made available to our patrons
- Bridgenorth courtyard project was completed
- Library Service Review was completed
- A reciprocal borrowing agreement was entered into with Galway-Cavendish & Harvey Township, City of Kawartha Lakes & Haliburton County

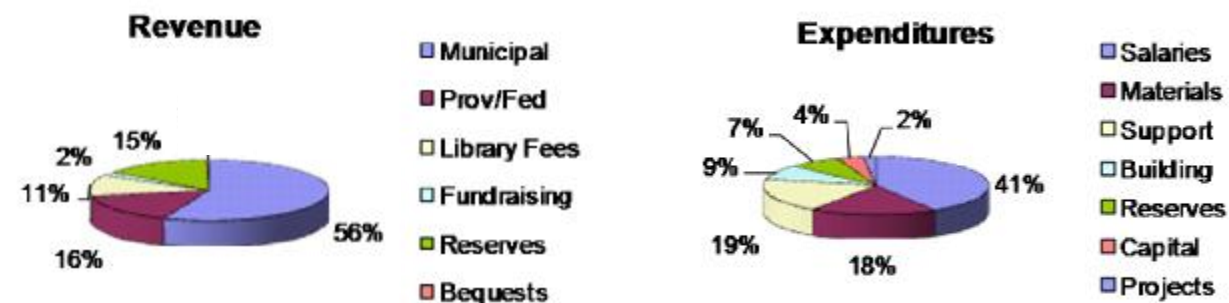
Programs
